ARTIST REQUIREMENTS

One entry per artist and one artist per poster

Must be between 5 - 18 years old

Must reside in a household, or be provided a housing-related service, managed by a NAHRO member agency

POSTER REQUIREMENTS

Must represent the theme
“What Home Means to Me”

Must have a landscape / horizontal orientation

Must be at least 11 x 8.5 inches (letter paper)
but no larger than 28 x 22 inches
